The City of Portland values all members of our community, and I'm writing to acknowledge that Mr. Delgado passed away in Portland on April 16, 2021. While the events are still being investigated, Mr. Delgado passed away as a result of the use of force by a member of the Portland Police Bureau.

The City of Portland is involved in an important community conversation about public safety in the City, and the Portland Committee on Community-Engaged Policing has recommended that the City reach out and express the City's condolences to the family of those who pass away as a result of the use of force by police officers. I agree with this recommendation coming from our community dialogue on policing, and I want to formally express our condolences on behalf of the City of Portland.

The City has also identified supportive services for family members and loved ones, and I have included information about these resources with this letter. If you would like any assistance contacting these supportive services, please let me know and we can help. Finally, I wanted to extend an offer to talk to the myself and Police Chief if you would like to continue this important conversation taking place in our City.
